

Getting and using the BSF Mobile App

BSF has a cell phone app with which you can do all (or any part of) your daily/weekly BSF lessons. You can get it on the Apple App Store and on the Google Play Store. Here are the links for Apple and Google, respectively (though just searching for it in your respective store may be better):

This is a different app than BSF's WordGo app, by the way. That's for other Bible studies, not for the regular BSF (Revelation) study. WordGo won't do the regular Revelation lessons (though it is useful for other Bible studies, e.g. during the summer).

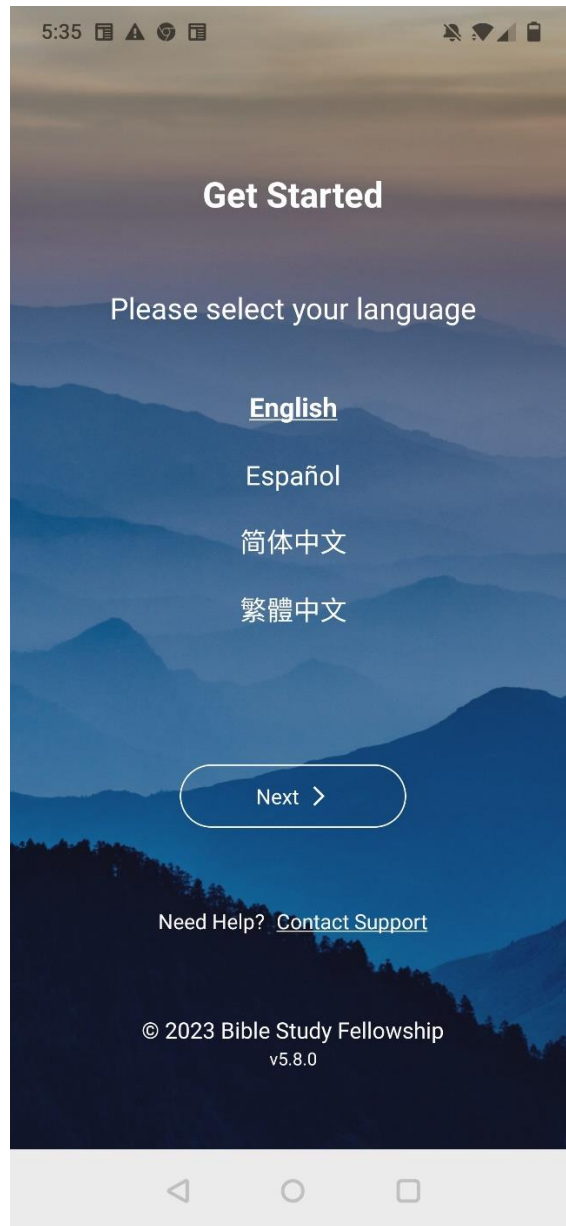
I haven't used the BSF app yet (I use my laptop for my studies, not my phone; but that's just me). But I hear that the app is really good and really useful. So if you prefer your phone to a laptop, check out the BSF app. It may be useful for you. (And I'll check it out, too.)

The following instructions from BSF show how to setup and use the app for the regular BSF Bible studies.

You can access the BSF App FAQ page by going to <https://www.bsfinternational.org/app/>. This page on the public website contains links to both the Apple Store and the Google Play Store where you can install the BSF App to your mobile phone or tablet. This page also contains a list of FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) to help you get started.

Once you have installed the BSF App to your device and opened it, you will need to select your language.



Next you will be prompted to log in using the same username (your email address) and password that you use on the MyBSF.org website.

If you do not remember your password, you can click on the “Forgot your password?” link to reset your password.

If you have never used the MyBSF.org website, you can click on the “Create an Account” link to create your account. If you are unsure if you have an account or not, the “Create an Account” link will tell you if you already have one and prompt you to log in.

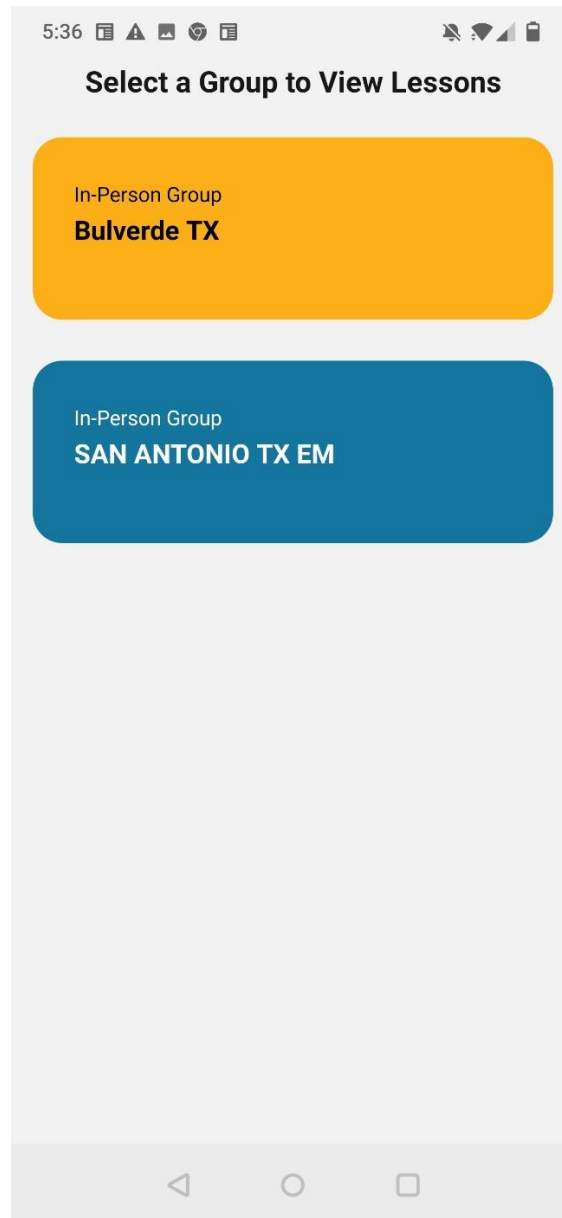

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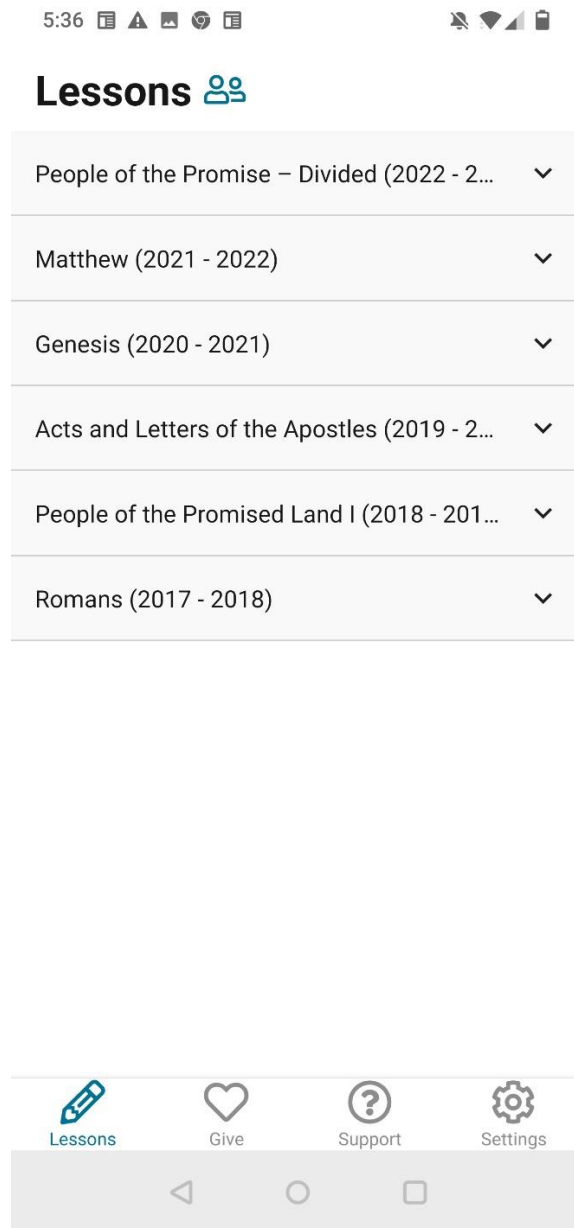

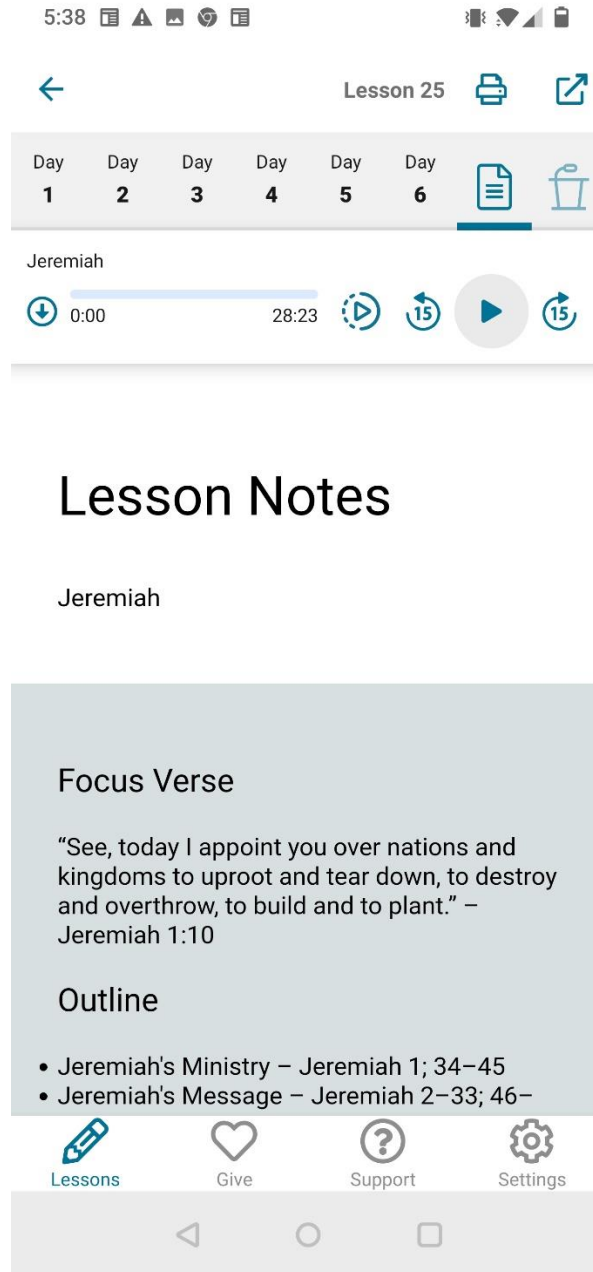

Clicking on the Notes icon (the blue icon that looks like a document) will open the Notes for the given lesson. The audio version of the notes is also available if you want to listen while you read or just listen.
