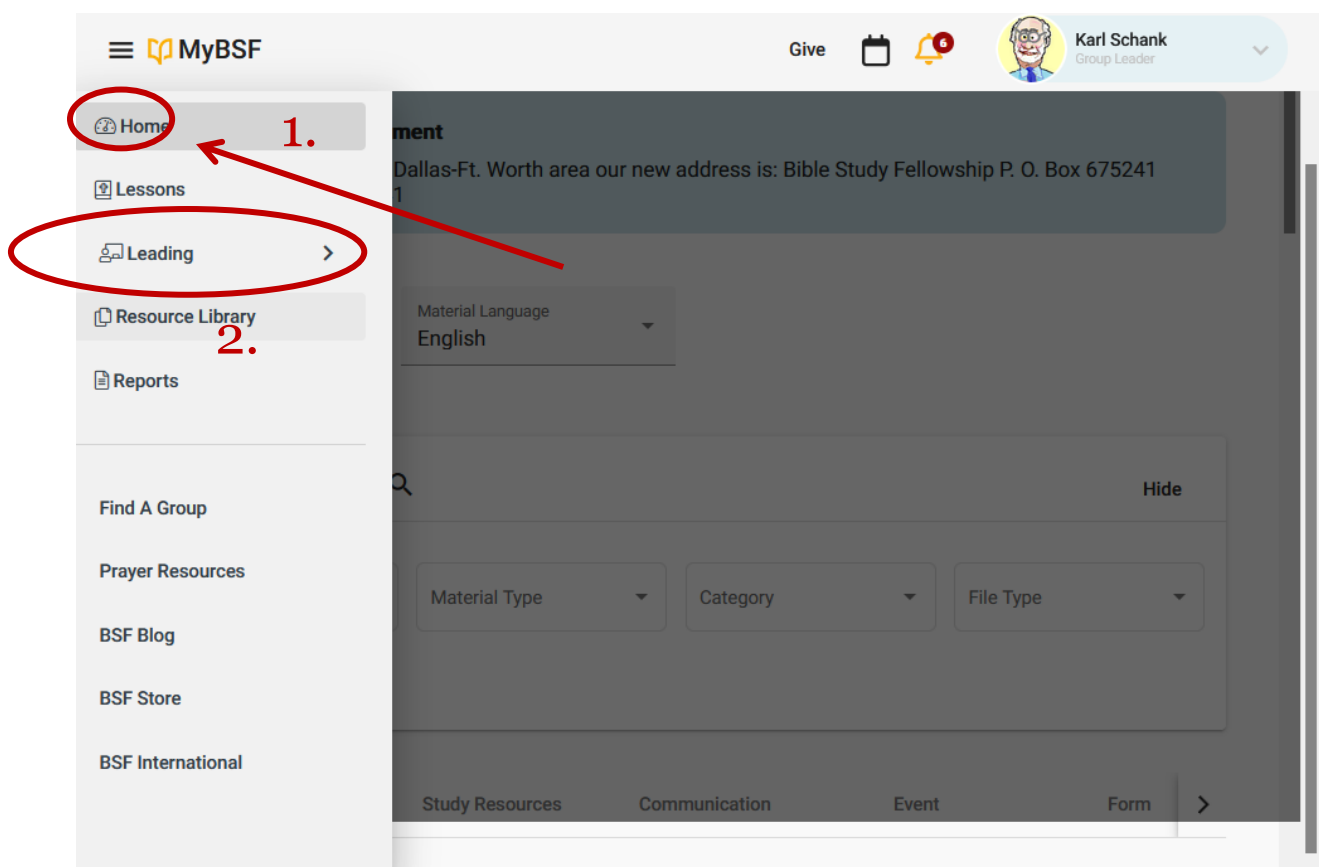


Navigating the MyBSF.org web site:

Finding lesson materials and lecture videos

1. Go to <https://www.mybsf.org/home> and login with your BSF UserID and PW. Then click on the e-line “hamburger” link in the upper right corner. Then click on *Lessons* in the left-hand pane:





2. That should bring up the current week's lesson. Let's say you're doing this on a Tuesday or later. Since our class lecture and discussion groups are on Monday, this will show the lesson for the current / coming week whose discussion will be *next* Monday. This will allow you to get the lesson materials for this week.

Access the lesson under “Questions and Notes” and “Adult Lesson (Questions = Notes)”. Click the *PDF* button and (depending on your browser), it should give you the option to open it in your browser and view it online, or to download it onto your computer (which is recommended).


3. However, if you want to view the lecture video (or play the lecture audio) – again assuming today is Tuesday or later – that would be the now-previous lesson not the current lesson.

To do that, click on the left  in a circle:
